	ROTARY HOUSE		
	In an email circulated earlier, TMBC have replied to my enquiry that they need no further information from WMPC, and have said they are likely to make a recommendation in about two weeks or thereabouts.		
	PLAN FOR 1600 HOUSES FOR EAST MALLING RESEARCH		
	On Thursday this week the East Malling Trust are displaying their plan for 1,600 houses between Hermitage Lane and Kiln Barn Lane at Orchard Conference Centre, East Malling Research, New Road East Malling between 1.30 and 7pm. A new spine road is also planned (dotted in blue on the map) from the Poppy Fields roundabout right across Hermitage Lane to Kiln Barn Lane and on to New Road East Malling. The plan includes clearing parked cars from East Malling High Street and forcing residents into a new car park off the station car park access road.		

This may well tempt general A20 traffic, as well as from this development, into the congested East Malling High Street and Mill Street, and potentially on into West Malling as drivers attempt to avoid the jams on the A20. I believe WMPC should therefore respond to the application.

## NEW HYTHE LANE TRAFFIC

A couple of weeks ago I asked for a multi-partner meeting about the speed and volume of traffic in New Hythe Lane, between Bellingham Way roundabout and the river.

This week I have been offered three meetings, one with KCC Highways officer and the other with the Police and the MP. After that I have a meeting with a top Highways Officer, to talk about what the meetings discussed.

#### KCC SALE OF COMMUNITY BUILDINGS

KCC sale of around 40 Community Buildings to raise around £6m towards a property maintenance backlog of over £150 million.

There will be a consultation drop in session at Larkfield Library from 10 till 1pm on Wednesday 8th February.

The only affected property locally is our Woodlands Childrens Centre in East Malling. Woodlands is not proposed for closure, but we still need to respond to the consultation to see that KCC doesn't change its mind. It delivers a wide range of support for children and potentially will in future deliver more virtual, outreach and group activities as well as providing office space for staff sharing accommodation.

No details have yet been provided of any adaptations to the building to allow this increase of services to take place.

In the rest of Tonbridge and Malling, KCC Gateway advice centre will move from Tonbridge Castle into Tonbridge Library . Tonbridge Youth Hub, and 2 Childrens Centre will all remain open. Snodland Holmesdale school will provide a family hub and youth centre

In debate I pointed out that investment in local bus services was needed to allow the best use of these buildings.

'Outreach work" in WM, and Leybourne was to be provided.

#### 58 AND 70 BUS ROUTES

No 58 and 70 daily bus services end this week, after KCC withdrew its subsidy, despite many objections.

Operator Nu Venture have however decided to offer at their own cost a one day per week return shopper journey on both routes until July.

They hope by then that the service will have become self funding, or that KCC will agree to share its cost with affected Parish Councils.

On Mondays from Feb 13th a number 70 service will run from Borough Green to West Malling, allowing one hour shopping in West Malling before it returns.

On Fridays from Feb 17th, a no 58 bus will run from Wrotham Square via Offham, Ryarsh, Birling, Trottiscliffe, Leybourne, West Malling, East Malling and Larkfield to Maidstone along the A20. This allows two hours shopping in the town centre, but will not include the Hospital on the route.

The Parish Alliance group of Parish Councils including West Malling and East Malling and Larkfield agreed to explore in principle the idea of part funding this one day per week shopper service after July. KCC will be asked to contribute £10,000 from a Government Bus Improvement Scheme grant . Parish Councils are considering making contributions based on their population to make up the remaining cost.Both West Malling and East Malling and Larkfield Parish Councils have stipulated that the service must stop at Maidstone Hospital as

the single journey by taxi now costs around £20.

(West Malling will decide if it want to back this idea at February's Parish Council meeting).

#### WEST MALLING LIBRARY REOPENS.

KCC say they are 'hopeful' that the West Malling Library will finally open on Tuesday this week. The Library has been closed for many month due to Covid, water leaks and an iffy carpet! I've asked for the outside to get a lick of paint too.

Councillors heard this week that a consultation on the future of all KCC libraries will be held later this year.

#### FOOD BANKS.

A special appeal has been made for Tinned Fruit, Cleaning and Hygiene products for the East Malling Community Centre Food Bank at Chapman Way. Tinned meat, rice and pasta are all in demand too. You can drop them off at 49, Offham Road, West Malling, the Kings Head Offham alternate Mondays, or deliver direct to the centre.

#### TREE PLANTING.

I've been out looking at possible sites for trees from my KCC £5,000 allocation. The West Malling CoE Primary School has planted 180 trees in a mini forest as part of the KCC scheme to plan a million trees. Medway Valley Countryside Partnership staff were helping the children to plant trees, each pupil planted at least one.

#### SEND COFFEE TO AN NHS WORKER

'Everydoctor' has created a scheme where people order coffee, which Every Doctor then post free to an NHS staff member who has requested it. Almost 2500 bags of coffee have already been sent to NHS staff, who appreciate this small sign of support during their long shifts.

Google "Everydoctor" to take part.

#### SINGLE USE PLASTIC BAN

A ban on some single-use plastics will come into force in England from October, the government has announced. To tackle the growing plastic problem, takeaways, restaurants and cafes must stop using single-use plastic cutlery, plates and bowls.

#### VOTER ID.

The Government says that in May elections this year, everyone must have photo identification before they are allowed to vote.

There was one conviction for voter fraud each year in 2016, 2017 and 2028, with none in intervening years.

A Drivers Licence, Passport, Seniors bus pass or Oracle Card (but not the over 18 one,) will be accepted. A Seniors Bus Pass is OK too, and an Oracle card, but NOT the one for 18 year olds.

We are encouraging people to apply for a Postal Vote as this does not need a photo, and the voting paper comes to you at home with a reply paid envelope. Search <a href="https://www.electoralcommission.org.uk">https://www.electoralcommission.org.uk</a> and follow the link for voting by post.

Another alternative is to apply online for a Voter Authority Certificate. This is just a piece of paper, not robust like a Polling Card so you will probably need a new one for every election. You apply to the electoral commission for the application form, which has to be returned to TMBC with a digital photograph.
