County councillors report February 2019

1. New police powers to tackle illegal Traveller camps.

Sajid Javid is to unveil tough new police powers to crack down on illegal Traveller sites on private land, potentially including a new criminal offence of trespass.

It appears this is for Councils to pursue stronger action on private land only and won't include council land. Whilst this is a move in the right direction, it would not prevent damage to council land, or assist our taxpayers The Daily Telegraph, Page: 1, 2 The Times, Page: 8

- 2. Government has clarified that in addition to action to use the M26, Manston Airport and part of M20 over which the Brock barriers will be put in place, they are also preparing to implement Operation Stack should all the other measures not prove sufficient after March 29th. The official document suggests that the hold ups could extend into several months. Schools and Care workers including Care Homes, been given advice in preparing for major road disruption which might interrupt the ability for staff to get to work, foodstuffs and fuel to be supplied. KCC staff unable to get to their usual place of work are being advised to go to Libraries to work instead.
- 3.. Larkfield Anti Social Behaviour Meeting held by Larkfield Community Group

It was good to see around 30 people at this meeting organised by Larkfield Community Group last Thursday evening. Suzi Leng our PCSO and Mandy Harris our Community Warden were on hand to explain their jobs. It was disappointing that Borough officers and Clarion Housing did not attend on the day. The Police reported that crime had fallen in the Larkfield area over the past twelve months, but accepted this could mean crimes were being under reported. They explained that the Police needed the help of residents in reporting incidents and registration numbers of offending vehicles so that the Police could follow up incidents.

The parents of young people involved in vandalism and intimidation had been visited, but action taken against some children was limited because of their age. i invited people to report to me the names of the offenders, so that action could be taken if they were truanting from school. I explained I am providing money from my KCC Councillors Community Fund to Scout groups in East Malling and Larkfield, and to Larkfield Football Club to help provide activities locally but people were right to be angry about the withdrawal of funds for Youth Work across the County.

I agreed to try to establish a similar group in Larkfield to the youth group meeting weekly in East Malling Community Centre, but funds were limited.

4. Police Emergency Phone Lines

I advised people who complained of the long waiting times for 101 to reply that Kent Police and Crime Commissioner Matthew Scott has suggested that people should try the anonymous free Crimestoppers number instead on 0800 555 111 or on line.

5. Number 58 bus.

KCC wants to cut its subsidy to the 58 bus by shortening its journey length. It is the only bus which goes to Maidstone Hospital from Wrotham Heath, Addington, Trottiscliffe, Ryarsh, Birling, Leybourne, West Malling, East Malling and Larkfield.

The KCC Consultation Document on the future of the number 58 service was published on Tuesday and you can fill it in on line, or if you want a paper copy you can pick one up at the exhibition (details below) or let me know and I will drop it off to you.

Two options are offered. The first is the bus terminating at Martin Square where passengers could change onto the 71 or 72 into Maidstone Town Centre. The second option is for the bus to terminate at the Hospital, saving 20 minutes on the current journey time of the bus. As I told KM TV, the 58 was needed because the Government put the hospital in a barmy out of the way place, with no commercial bus services. As I recently discovered, if you need to get to the Hospital as a patient or visitor without a car, a taxi will cost you about £10 each way from West Malling.

A public exhibition for the plans for the bus no 58 was held at East Malling Institute, Mill Street on today 1pm to 4pm. It was attended by about 40 people. I was concerned that there was no material on display boards. Copies of the Consultation Document with reply questionnaire had run out, only 28 having been printed. No list of people who attended was kept. The length of journey times is mis represented as it assumes that people would change services at Maidstone Hopsital to proceed to Maidstone under option 2. In practice they would change at Wealden Hall. People were advised by officers that they could vote not to change the service at all, which is not an option in the consultation document, and may in practice not be an option either.

Consultation closes on 19th February.
