518.3	Site meeting with Streetlights contractor, Ken Bonner Ms Margetts reported on the recent site meeting with Ken Bonner of Streetlights which concentrated on the additional column in Swan Street.			

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	It was noted that the costs for UKPN had been received (£4211.00) and that costs for the column and planning permission were awaited. It was noted that the sum of £5993 has been safeguarded for this project and that a recommendation may need to be made to Full Council requesting further monies from reserves to cover any shortfall.		
	It was noted that Mr Bonner has contacts with a contractor who may be able to offer advice on the installation of EV charging points within the parish.		
22/519	<u>SPEEDWATCH</u>		
	Mrs Dean had expressed an interest in funding a new hand held device from her KCC Combined Members Fund. This funding may need to include bodycams which volunteers are entitled to wear during sessions.		
	It was noted that a new co-ordinator would need to be recruited. It was agreed to ask Kent Police whether car information can be downloaded to the system rather than having to input each registration, make and model individually.	Clerk	
	It was agreed to send an email out to residents advising them of the Speedwatch scheme and to make a request for volunteers.		
22/520	HIGHWAYS IMPROVEMENT PLAN		
	The Highways Improvement Plan was last reviewed in December 2021. On considering the plan the following was noted:		
	Priority 1 – High Street – footpath on the opposite side of the road. It was noted that bollards had been installed. Clerk to request that this be deleted from future plans.		
	Priority 2 – St Leonards Street – dangerous footpath crossing near to St Leonards Tower. This issue was to be monitored by WMPC & KCC. It was agreed that this site is still dangerous and therefore should remain on the plan.		
	Priority 3 – High Street, parking bays – issue with cars parking diagonally. It was agreed to speak with T&MBC to ask for the current parking scheme to be assessed, it was also agreed to speak with Nu Venture who have in the past expressed concern about the danger of cars reversing out into the High Street.	Clerk	
	Priority 4 – Cars / vans mounting the kerb outside the Chocolate Umbrella shop. It was agreed that this remain on the plan.		
	Priority 5 – Police Station Road – suggestion for advance warning signs of the junction on Swan Street. It was agreed to consider this further at the December meeting.		
	Subsequent to the meeting it was confirmed that a junction warning sign had been added to a post in Swan Street. The Clerk to request that this be deleted from future plans.		
	Priority 6 – Nevill Court – additional signage to warn lorry drivers of the weak bridge so as to deter drivers from turning round in Nevill Court. This has not been investigated by KCC. It was agreed that this remain on the plan.		
	Priority 7 – Two 90 degree bends in the road near St Mary's Church, High Street – 2 sharp bends causing drivers to drive partially on the other side of the road. It was agreed that although KCC has ruled out painting white dashed lines in the middle of the road that this remain on the plan to enable WMPC to monitor.		
	Priority 8 – impaired road markings at several West Malling junctions – it was agreed to remove this from future plans as KCC advise that this should be reported via the KCC portal.		
	Priority 9 – junction with Alma Road & Norman Road – KCC has advised that road markings can be refreshed (report via portal) and that no further signage will be added due to a lack of collision data. Clerk to request that this be deleted from future plans.
